Protecting Land & Water

Agriculture Land Preservation - We are pleased to see a 250 acre farm on Byerly Road now interested in the Agriculture Land Preservation Program. Baltimore County now has over 49,698 acres in Land Preservation



Programs. Currently a new Land Preservation District of 285 acres is being created that will start along Glen Falls Road and will run north along Route 30 to the north of Mt-Gilead. This will border 100+ acres in the Midsummer Hill Conservancy. Efforts are underway to possibly increase this to over 600 acres in the future.

Improving Water Quality - Currently several farmers in the HRA area are participating in Conservation Reserve Programs that helps protect streams, reservoirs and rivers from storm water run off. Ground cover improves soil, water, and air quality, and also provide habitat for song birds and wildlife. Lippy Brothers have over 300 acres in warm summer grasses planted that provide



stream buffers. Ridgeview Farms has over 12,000 trees planted on 30 acres along streams that will provide leaf manner and grass strips for steam buffers.

Proposed Development

There is a proposed three lot subdivision on a 14.163 acre parcel of land owned by Fred Schaefer located along Old Hanover Road across from Piney Grove Road. This proposal requested permission to transfer one density from a 3.77 acre parcel to the 14.163 acres parcel for the requested three lot subdivision. The plat plan for the proposed development will be available for review at the April meeting.

Administration to make our case for improvements to MD 30. One area for improvement is Bortner Road and MD 30 – A study was completed to determine what would be required to improve sight distance at the intersection. The cost of making this change would be quite substantial. Accident statistics do not support the need for such a large scale improvement. An intersection control beacon (Flashing signal) will be installed in late April.

Zoning Changes
